

Introduction to Bird Ringing

This special two-day course will be delivered through a combination of classroom and outdoor field sessions designed to provide participants with a wide-ranging knowledge of bird survey techniques and detailed knowledge and experience of bird ringing. Learning outcomes include:

- Bird Identification
- The aim of survey methodologies such as bird ringing
- Use of field equipment
- Practical participation in bird ringing
- How to get involved
- Accessing and interpreting research literature

The course will provide participants with a broad experience in bird ecology and is highly recommended for those who wish to work towards their own bird ringing license. Due to the sensitive nature of the survey technique, places on the course are limited.

Parc Slip Nature reserve supports numerous breeding bird species, including species of conservation concern, such as lapwing, bullfinch and song thrush.
